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What Is Place & Power?



- A move beyond land acknowledgments to more meaningful engagements with the past, present, and future of this place
- A three-credit course requirement for all Faculty of Arts students, beginning in fall 2024
- A chance for students to see themselves as being "inside the story" of large structures such as settler colonialism and racial capitalism, grounded in and radiating out from unceded Musqueam territory
- An opportunity for diverse disciplinary (and cross-disciplinary) encounters with questions of place, power, and positionality

Guiding Values of Place and Power



- Relationality: building a decentralized community of practice
- Pacing: moving slowly and deliberately and learning together
- **Vibrancy:** not letting bureaucracy get in the way of excitement over the subject
